Garuda is a bird-like deity in Indian mythology. The British Library exhibition showed a *thangka* (a traditional Tibetan scroll helping focus prayer and meditation) with Garuda drawn in gold ink on indigo-dyed paper.

In the Vajrayana Buddhist tradition Garuda protects against diseases and poisoning. Much information about Garuda in Hindu, Buddhist and Jain faiths is at this Wikipedia entry.



This was another "grand day out"!











